- Classes 1-37 produce must be grown in Cutcombe Parish or Cutcombe First School catchment area
- Classes 70-89 only open to residents of Cutcombe Parish or Cutcombe First School catchment area
- For jam, jellies \& chutneys, all should be entered with cellophane tops and not metal lids.
- Adult Handicrafts: Items will not be auctioned unless they are clearly marked 'FOR SALE'. All entries whether for sale or not will be judged. Items not for sale will be returned to the exhibitor.
- Photography: All photographs must bear the class number and exhibitors name on the reverse in pencil. Photographs must have been taken since the last fete and max. printed size of 6 inches $\times 4$ inches.
